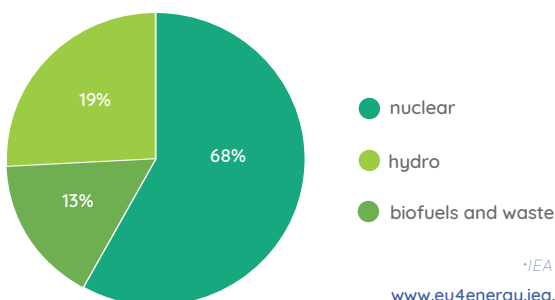
To do this, the EU supports projects that:

Covenant of Mayors

The Covenant of Mayors is the world's largest movement for local climate and energy actions, bringing together thousands of local governments voluntarily committed to implementing EU climate and energy objectives. Signatory cities pledge to reduce greenhouse gas emissions **by 40% by 2030** and adopt a joint approach to tackling mitigation and adaptation to climate change. As of March 2020, **Armenia boasted 26 active signatories** to the initiative, **covering almost 58% of the population**.

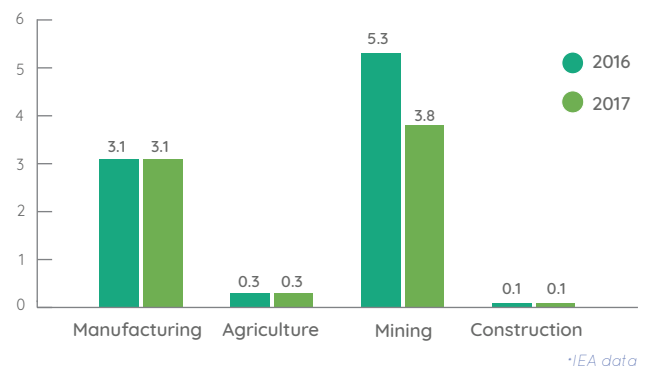
Armenia's energy production 2017*
