The EU4 Gender Equality Reform Helpdesk provides demanddriven assistance to governments and EU Delegations in Eastern Partnership countries on mainstreaming gender in policy-making and the implementation of reforms to ensure the delivery of effective results for women and men.

 - Ministry of Internally Displaced Persons from the Occupied Territories, Labour, Health and Social Affairs of Georgia, 20 July 2022 (14 participants – 11 women and 3 men)


Assistance for organising public participation and consultation working groups:

- Support for the EU Delegation to Georgia to organise a meeting with the Government and Parliament of Georgia to present the Country Level Implementation Plan (CLIP)
- Support for the Parliament of Georgia with the public presentation of the Gender Impact Assessment of the Draft Law of Georgia on Food Loss and Waste Reduction, Food Recovery and Redistribution
- Coaching on how to undertake a gender impact assessment of professional military service reform for representatives of the Ministry of Defence of Georgia (13 participants – 11 women and 2 men)

Study visit:

 Organisation of a visit of representatives of the Government of Armenia to Georgia to share experiences of combatting sexual and gender-based violence, and domestic violence, 27–30 June 2022
 The visit involved meetings with governmental institutions in Georgia, including the Inter-agency Commission on Gender Equality, Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence; the Gender Equality Council of the Parliament of Georgia; the Public Defender's Office of Georgia; the National Statistics Office of Georgia (GEOSTAT); the Ministry of Internal Affairs; the Ministry of Internally Displaced Persons, Labour, Health and Social Affairs of Georgia; and the Agency for State Care and Assistance for Victims of Human Trafficking. Participants forged closer ties, shared experiences, and the Public Defender's Offices of Georgia and Armenia now plan to conduct joint research
